"On Shore's Surprise Mine the tunnel was extended for some 500 feet without striking any gold bearing stone".

Secretary for Mines Report, 1921.

"Shore's Success Mine. Driving was continued during the year for a further 400 feet in the lower tunnel but no gold-bearing stone was met with".

Secretary for Mines Report, 1922.

"Shore's Success Mine. The No. 4 tunnel was picked up, cleaned out and drained and a truck line laid, but no ore was taken out".
