MEMORANDUM:

POSSIBILITIES OF UNDERGROUND WATER

AT SHOT TOWER TAROONA

On the 31st ultimo, I visited the Shot
T ower and interviewed the owner, Mr. H.V. McKay,
who is anxious to obtain, by drilling, supplies
of underground water to augment his present water
supplies. Mr. McKay runs a small mixed farm at
the Shot Tower, below the Kingston Road, half way
up the Bonnet Hill. The area is underlain by
dolerite which is not an aquifer. Faulting has taken
place extensively near Hobart and A. N. Lewis shows
a fault striking North and South in the Taroona
locality. This fault may contain supplies of
underground water, but there is no surface indication
of it on Mr. McKay's property and it is considered
too risky and expensive to bore probably for several
hundred feet in the slight chance of locating it.

I have told Mr. McKay that I do not recommend boring for underground water on his property.
