MEMORANDUM:

I have examined the outcrop on the Devonport Golf Club Property mentioned by Mr. V. Horton. The rocks are sandstones overlying mudstones of Permian Age and they dip at small angles to the north-east. This outcrop is on the western boundary of the property and the sandstones should contain small quantities of underground water at fairly shallow depths. To the east of the property, near the Mersey River, there should be a greater thickness of sandstone. The dip of these rocks confirms my previous opinion concerning the depth to artesian water.

I have discussed these points with Mr. Horton.
