MEMORANDUM

At the time of my visit to the wolfram show at Upper Scamander, held in the name of H.J. Lutwyche, the approach to the adit was being formed. At that time Messrs. Lutwyche and Dickens, who were doing the work, were not underground.

The direction in which the adit was being driven was in general W.S.W. to cut a vein which had been traced in a south-westerly direction for some 200 yards. It was the expressed intention of Lurwyche and Dickens once they were underground to turn their adit in a more westerly direction to shorten the distance to cut the vein. As they are now 12 feet underground some work has been done since my visit.
