Andrew,

I apologise for the delay in sending you our reply.

We are happy for GSLM to conduct the seismic survey under the following conditions;

1. The survey is to approach no closer than 200m to the pipeline. As you are surveying outside of the planning corridor this is adequate. This boundary applies to the trucks only, we are happy to allow the geophones to be laid within the boundary and across the pipeline. Our greatest concerns for the survey are the vibration that the trucks produce and the weight of the survey equipment over the pipeline.
2. The survey trucks are to use appropriate roads to cross the pipeline at any point. The survey is not to be carried out above the pipeline.

Please take this email to be confirmation that we are happy for the survey to go ahead as proposed in the shape file you sent.

Dear Fiona,

Thank you for meeting with us in Hobart on the 6<sup>th</sup> February. As discussed in the meeting, I have attached the revised shot point data (in excel format) for the proposed seismic survey lines that approach the Tasmanian Gas Pipeline for you to review. We have ensured all planned seismic lines that approach the pipeline start outside of the Pipeline Planning Corridor.

Can you please check the revised shot point data for the proposed lines that approach the pipeline and if you are satisfied with the revised lines, can you please provide us with the following?

1. A conditional letter of approval for Great South Land Minerals to conduct seismic operations near the Tasmanian Gas Pipeline
2. Any operational parameters for Great South Land Minerals to conduct seismic operations near the Tasmanian Gas Pipeline

Also in the meeting you mentioned a third party document regarding the use of explosives, peak velocity testing etc. I think we already have the document you are referring to. Is it titled "Tasmanian Gas Pipeline – Third Party Access Right of Way PO-698-PR-RW-002"? If not, can you please forward the document you were referring to?

And finally, did you have any discussions about the proposed seismic survey with your contact who manages the fibre optic cable that runs adjacent the gas pipeline? If so, are there any concerns with the proposed seismic program affecting the fibre optic cable?
