

## MINING NEWS.

### GOLD.

We learn that the Hon. Minister of Lands and Works has given authority to the Victoria Company to proceed with the construction of their tramway at Salisbury, over a portion of Mr White's lease, the question of compensation to be settled by B. Shaw, Esq., Commissioner of Goldfields, on his next visit to the district.

The adjourned extraordinary meeting of shareholders in the New Native Youth Company, for the extension of the capital of the Company, will be held at the office of the Company to-morrow evening, at 8 o'clock, when shareholders are requested to attend.

The fourth call of sixpence per share has been made on the shares of the Great Extended West Chum Company, payable on Friday next. The manager notifies that unless the third call of sixpence per share, due on the 19th May last, is paid into the office of the Company the shares upon which the same remains unpaid will be liable to forfeiture.

Application is made to register the Rob Roy Company, Lefroy.

A call, the first, of 3d per share, has been made in the Mount Cameron Co., payable on Thursday.
